



We have seen an epidemic of special corporate interests control our congresses and senates, both nationally to our own back yards. There is immense frustration present as it has become painfully visible.

Exit polls serve an important purpose. They are the canary in the mine.

However campaigns that marginalize exit polls has plagued voters over several decades. These cast doubt in cases where results became too unbelievable. But as we all know now, those exit polls were not necessarily wrong... Bad people got elected anyway.

How can the public know with reasonable certainty?

UnInformed Consent and The Wellington Times are doing a citizen's performance audit on the results of the KC Election results with the WDV voter base.

We will canvas each voter who voted in the last election. By making direct contact with the originator of each vote, there can be less possibility of contamination of the end results.

Our results will be compared to King County's results.

If those results are statistically and significantly skewed, our results will be immediately handed over to state authorities.

If they are not skewed then we have a reasonable basis for believing the current system has not been compromised.

How do we verify each vote?

We will provide an affidavit/declaration for each participant. The participant will swear as to how they voted. The idea is that this is collection of real data from the originator of the ballot.

KCE will have every opportunity to cross reference a rather small sampling of the voter base with our data. So it is cost-effective.

The design is reliable because it is difficult it is to manipulate hard data. In order to be able to verify the voter, each participant will have to provide ID and confirm that they are a registered voter in the Woodinville district. This way, if something is askew, there will be confirmable data that will be legally useful later.

If there is a statistically significant difference in our totals compared to KC's then we will report this to the authorities.

If there is *not* a significant difference in our totals compared to KC's we will also report this.

This audit is a simple seeking of factual data. Proving inconsistencies does not require 100% of the voter base. It is also completely voluntary.
